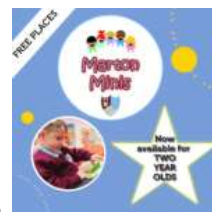
**Parking**

- Control app downloads and purchases
- Make the games console safe and secure
- Use safety mode on YouTube and Google
- If using social networks, check privacy settings
